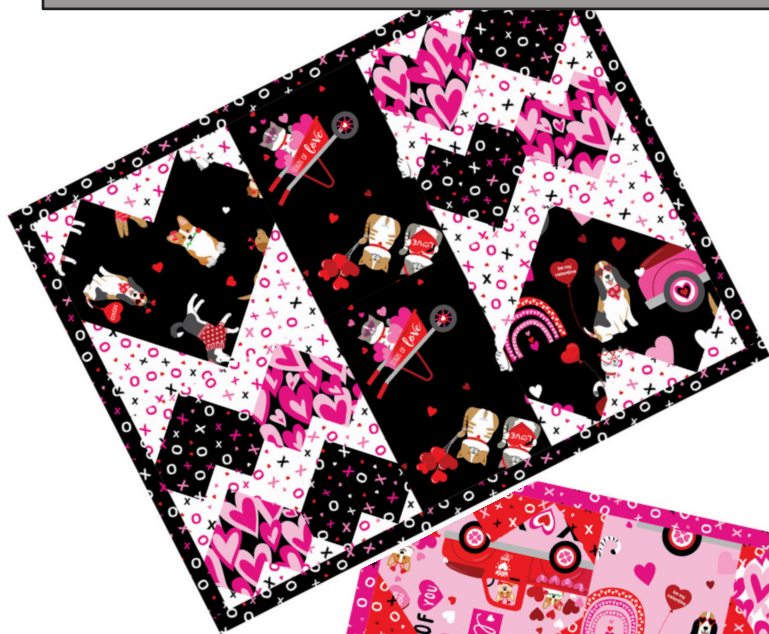

Heart To Heart utilizes six colors to make up this placemat. Each heart unit is sewn the same yet there are two different sizes. One or more can be made to decorate for a special festive occasion. Cover: "Love You Fur-ever fabrics by Benartex. Two colorways have been provided. Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

Notions: Standard foot, coordinating thread, rotary cutter, cutting mat, ruler, scissors, clips or pins, 90/14 needle.

Fabric Yardage Required:

**More fabric may be required if using directional fabric or fussy cutting. Adjust amounts as needed.

**Quilt color key is located inside the pattern.







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Cutting Chart

Read all instructions prior to cutting fabric. Cutting instructions based on 42" of usable fabric width.

Fabric	Cut
Fabric A *Contrast Fabric 	<p><u>Cut sixteen 3 1/2" squares:</u> Cut two strips 3 1/2" by WOF. Sub-cut into 3 1/2" squares (Used for the large hearts-bottom unit)</p> <p><u>Cut one hundred twenty eight 1 1/4" squares:</u> Cut two strips of 1 1/4" by WOF. Sub-cut 1 1/4" squares (Small hearts-top left/right)</p> <p><u>Cut ninety six 2" squares:</u> Cut six strips of 2" by WOF. Sub-cut 2" squares (8 for the large hearts, 16 for the small hearts)</p>
Fabric B 	<p><u>Cut eight rectangles:</u> 6 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles for the center sections or cut four: 4 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangle if the fabric is non-directional.</p>
Fabric C 	<p><u>Cut eight rectangles:</u> 6 1/2" x 3 1/2" rectangles for eight of the heart halves.</p>
Fabric D 	<p><u>Cut eight rectangles:</u> 6 1/2" x 3 1/2" rectangles for eight of the heart halves.</p>
Fabric E 	<p><u>Cut thirty two rectangles:</u> 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles for sixteen of the heart halves.</p>
Fabric F *Includes Binding And Backing 	<p><u>Cut eight strips:</u> 2 1/4" strips by WOF(Binding)</p> <p><u>Cut four rectangles:</u> 13" x 17" rectangles (Backing)</p> <p><u>Cut thirty two rectangles:</u> 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles for sixteen of the smaller heart halves.</p>

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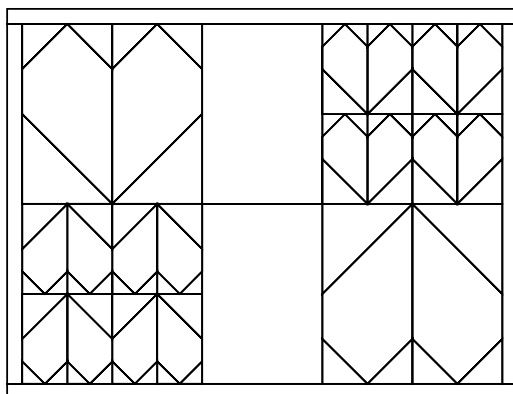
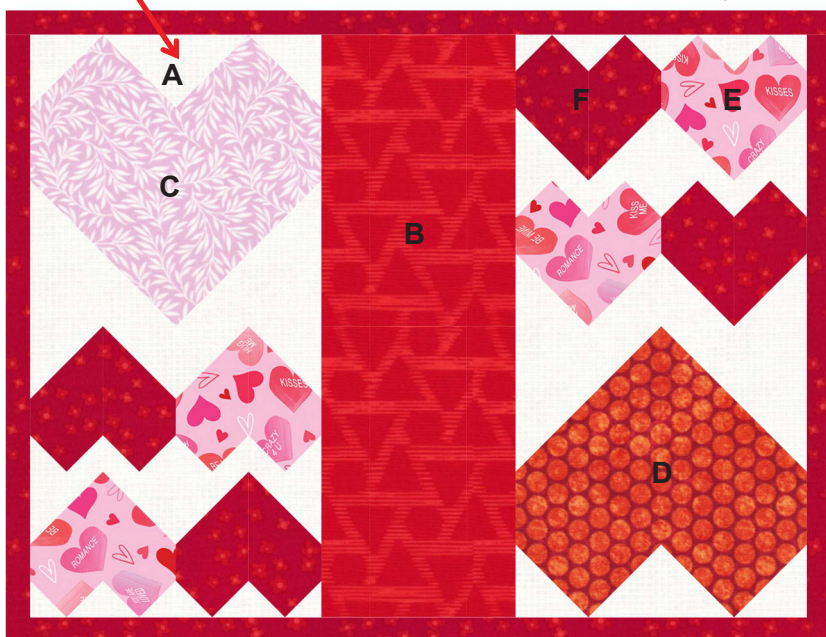
Fabric Color Key

Each color is identified and represented with letters.

F = Binding

A = Contrast fabric

Printing the pdf pattern in color is helpful when putting together the units and blocks.



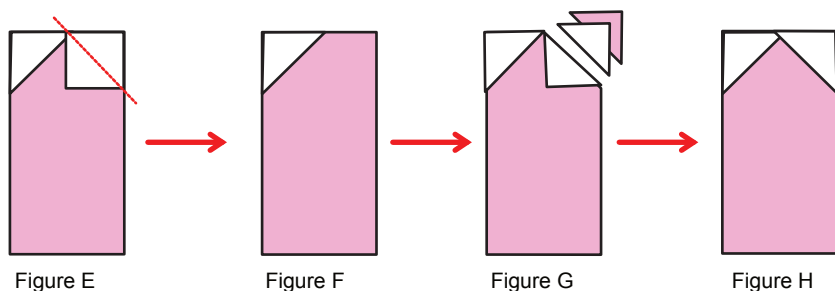
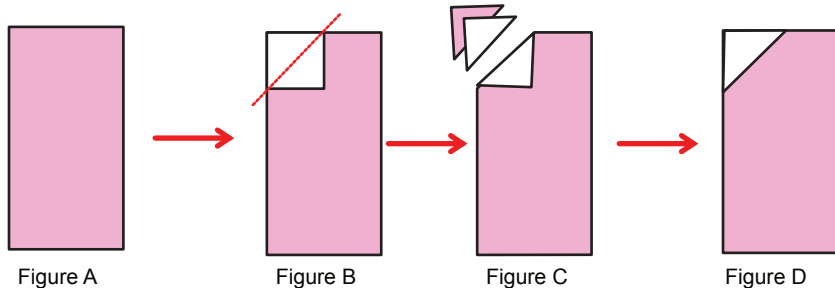
- Read through all of the directions prior to cutting and piecing the fabric.
- All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ "
- Press seams to one side or open.
- Printing a color copy will be helpful when aligning pieces and blocks
- **Refer to the color in the yardage and sample diagram.**

Helpful Sewing Terms:

- WOF- Width Of Fabric
- RST- Right Sides Together
- WST- Wrong Sides Together

Large Heart Block Assembly: (**Each heart half unit is formed separately.)

1. Take one $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and place it right side up (Figure A).
2. Put one 2" square right side down on the top left corner of the large rectangle (Figure B).
3. On the wrong side of the 2" square fabric, draw a diagonal line from the top right corner of the small rectangle to the bottom left corner of the small rectangle (Figure B).
4. Sew on the drawn line.
5. Trim a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Figure C). Press toward the corner (Figure D).
Repeat steps 1-4 with the other upper right corner except draw the diagonal line from the top left side of the square to the bottom right side of the square (Figures E-H).



Large Heart Block Assembly Continued:

6. Take one 3 ½" square and place it right side down along the bottom large rectangle (Figure I).
 7. On the wrong side of the large square fabric, draw a diagonal line from the top right corner of the large rectangle to the bottom left corner of the large square (Figure I).
 8. Trim a ¼" seam allowance (Figure J). Press toward the corner (Figure K) to form the right side heart half.
 9. Repeat steps 1-8 to form the other half of the heart **except** the bottom 3 ½" square will be marked from the top left side of the square to the bottom right side of the square (Figure L). Figure L denotes the diagonal marking from top left to bottom right and pressed (Figure M).
 10. Take the two halves and place them RST (Figure N). Sew a ¼" seam allowance along the vertical edge. Press the seam. The block is complete (Figure O).
- **Repeat steps 1-10 to sew more large hearts. Two large hearts are used in the pattern but the pattern can be changed to make four large hearts for the placemat instead of making the small hearts.**

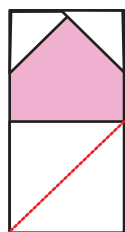

Small Heart Block Assembly

1. The process to make the small hearts is the same as the large hearts. Follow steps 1-10 to make the small hearts.

One Heart Block requires:

- Two: 2" x 3 ½" rectangles (Right or left side of the heart)
- Four: 1 ¼" squares (Top left and right pieces)
- Two: 2" square (Placed at the bottom of the rectangle.)



- ** Piece together the small heart blocks in the same manner as the large heart block. Once one block is pieced together, sew each small heart block to another small heart block to form four hearts (In rows of two stacked on each other.)

Center Rectangle Blocks Assembly:

1. Take two 6 ½" x 4 ¼" rectangles and place them RST along the short sides.
2. Sew ¼" seam allowance along the short side.
3. Press seams.

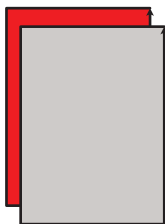


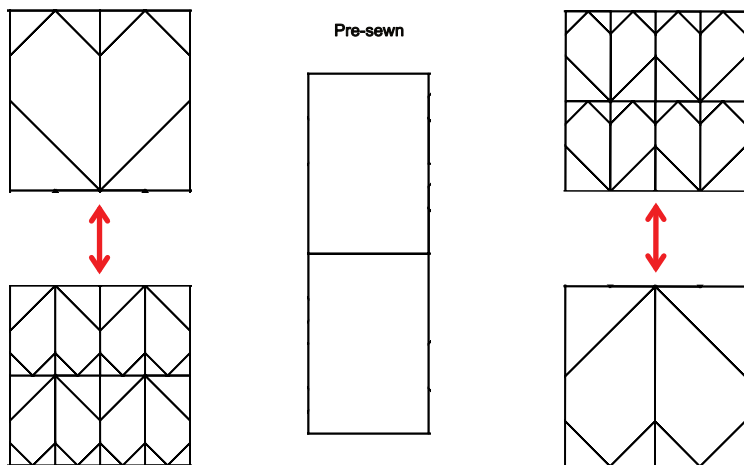

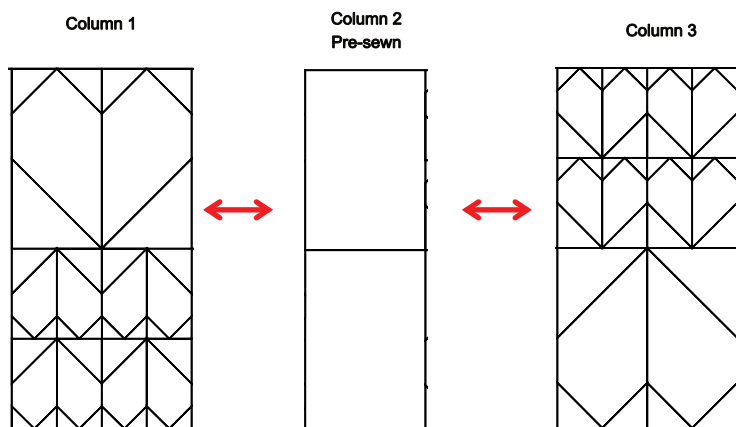
Sewing The Blocks Together:

1. Lay out blocks using the example below and on page two. The layout is a suggestion and the blocks can be moved to anywhere you choose.
2. Take one large heart block and one small four heart block and place RST with the points of the hearts aligned at each other.
3. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance and press. Repeat with the other two heart blocks.
4. The rectangle blocks were pre-sewn in a previous step.



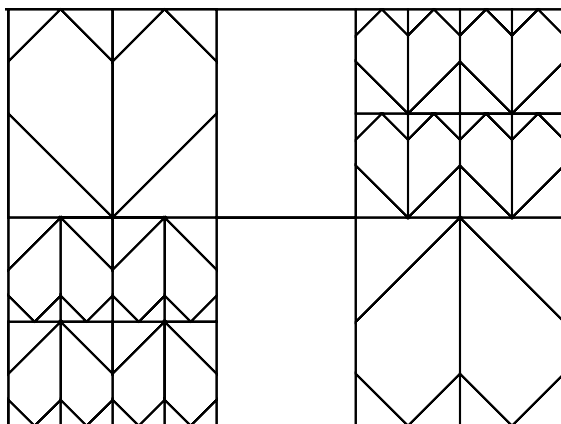
Placemat Top Assembly:

1. Sew column 1 to 2 RST and then 2 to 3 RST. Press after sewing each seam.



Placemat Assembly):

1. Make a quilt sandwich by laying the backing wrong side up. Place the batting on top of it.
3. Place the placemat top right side up on top of the batting. Both the top and backing are WST (Wrong Sides Together) with the batting sandwiched in the middle. Pin and baste all three layers together. Quilt all three layers together. Square up the quilt and trim off excess backing and batting.



Binding:

4. Cut binding strips **2 1/4" wide x WOF**. **Cut 2**. Piece together binding strips by placing them RST perpendicular to each other (Figure A). Sew on the diagonal as shown. Trim off excess and press (Figure B). Repeat with all the strips until they form one long binding strip.
5. Fold binding lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
6. Attach binding to the front of the quilt (Figure C). Attach along the perimeter with the raw edge of the binding meeting the raw edges of the quilt. Fold over to the back, press and hand sew or machine sew on to the back.

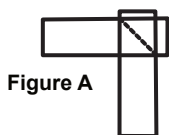

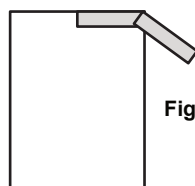
