(2) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips.
(2) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips.
(7) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips.*
(2) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 33-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips.
(2) 2 " x 24-1/2" WOF strips.
(6) 2" x WOF strips.*
(2) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x OF strips. Subcut (14) 4-1/2" squares.
(7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (112) 2-1/2" squares.
(4) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Subcut (56) 2-1/2" squares.
(7) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Subcut (56) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
(14) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (224) 2-1/2" squares.
(4) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (56) 2-1/2" squares.
(2) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 77$ " LOF strips.
(2) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 65$ " LOF strips.
(8) 2 " x WOF strips.*
(7) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips, BINDING.

* SEW STRIPS VIA SHORT ENDS THEN GO TO BORDER ASSEMBLY WOF/LOF=WIDTH/LENGTH OF FABRIC

BLOCK ASSEMBLY PROJECT USES PRECISE 1/4" SEAMS. TEST YOUR SEAM ALLOWANCE BY CUTTING (2) 2-1/2" X 5" RECTANGLES. STITCH THEM TOGETHER ALONG THE 5" LENGTH. AT THE MIDPOINT, MEASURE ACROSS THE UNIT. IT SHOULD BE EXACTLY 4-1/2" WIDE. IF NOT, ADJUST YOUR SEAM ALLOWANCE AND REPEAT.

Note: The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) B $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to each side of the $\mathbf{A}$ 19-1/2" x 31-1/2" rectangle. Sew (1) B 1-1/2" x 21-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the A rectangle to make the Center Block.

2. Sew (1) I $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square to the left side of (1) H 2-1/2" square to make the top row. Sew (1) H 2-1/2" square to the left side (1) F 2-1/2" square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 4-1/2" Unit 1 square. Repeat to make (56) Unit 1 squares total.

3. Place (1) H $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square on the left side of (1) G $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance.

4. Place another $\mathbf{H} 2-1 / 2$ " square on the right side of the G $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip.
5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (56) Unit 2 strips total.
6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to the diagram below for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (56) Unit 3 strips.

8. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each side of (1) D 4-1/2" square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12-1/2" Block One square. Repeat to make (14) Block One squares total.

7. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to the top of
(1) Unit 3 strip lengthwise to make (1)
$4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Unit 4 square. Repeat to make
(56) Unit 4 squares total.


## Side Border

9. Sew together (3) Block One squares to make (1) Side Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border.

10. Sew together (4) Block One squares to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

Top/Bottom Border make 2


## Quilt Assembly

11. Sew (1) C 2 " $\times 33-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) C 2" x 24-1/2" strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.
13. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

BORDER ASSEMBLY MEASURE WIDTH AND LENGTH OF THE QUILT TOP TO ENSURE C, B, J AND K BORDER SIZES, BELOW ARE OUR CUTTING SIZES.
14. Sew (1) C $2^{\prime \prime} x\left(60-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) C 2" x (51-1/2") strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
15. Sew (1) B $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times\left(63-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) B 1-1/2" x (53-1/2") strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
16. Center (1) J 4-1/2" $x$ ( $77^{\prime \prime}$ ) strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
17. Repeat Step 16 to sew (1) J $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times\left(65^{\prime \prime}\right)$ strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides.
18. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in the diagram below), draw a 45 -degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

19. Sew (1) K 2 " $x\left(73-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) K 2" x (64-1/2") strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

FINISHING Cut batting and backing 3 " larger than top on all sides. Layer backing, batting and top together and baste or pin. When quilting is completed, trim excess batting and backing. Bind as usual.

FINISHED SIZE: 64" x 76"
